Free Lung Nodule Evaluation Seminar**

Roseburg, November 9, 2015 – The Community Cancer Center is offering free medical personnel continuing education seminar for lung nodule evaluation. The seminar will take place on Wednesday, November 9, 2015 from 7:30 am – 9:30 am at the Community Cancer Center in conference rooms A, B and C.
